Dear Halil İbrahim Karataş:

On May 12, 2025, you were notified that the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) initiated investigations respecting the alleged injurious dumping of steel strapping originating in or exported from the People's Republic of China (China), the Republic of Korea, the Republic of Türkiye, and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, and the injurious subsidizing of steel strapping originating in or exported from China.

The *Special Import Measures Act* (SIMA) provides that, under normal circumstances, the preliminary phase of the investigations shall be completed within 90 days of the date of initiation. However, due to the complexity and novelty of issues presented in the investigations, number of persons involved, and difficulty in obtaining satisfactory evidence, the period has been extended to 135 days, pursuant to subsection 39(1) of SIMA.

Consequently, the decision to issue preliminary determinations or to terminate the investigations with respect to some or all of the goods will be made on or before September 24, 2025. The CBSA will inform you of the decision at that time.
